15 miles came to on port tack under short sail -

the fore part light N. by W. wind course
S. by W. Run down along the land. E. Reef part
2 P.M. Latter part downed L. Reef a swordfish

different tacks at 10. 15 a.m. kept off N. E. by N. Latter
part course N. by E. Came to on star tack at 3 P.M.
under M. & Star sails. Nothing seen -

Thursday. Jan 31st 1884

the fore part a strong S. & E. breeze & squally
at 6.30 A.M. 3000 Whales sailed by. Windy & overcast
3 boats S. & W. & S. Star boat got one. Latter part were
now cutting galls & cut whales only in to night laying
on star tack with the head along side of S. & E. of the
perished 10 m

Friday. Feb. 1st 1884

the fore part have the head on & cleared the
case away Latter part started the works. Nothing
seen through the day -

Saturday. Feb. 2nd 1884

the fore part a strong S. breeze on star tack
boiling saw a whale supposed to be C. W. M. Whaling
Latter part on star tack. at 6 P.M. saw the other
vessel laying aback under short sail - see nothing

N. by W. on port tack boiling Latter part on star
tack, at 9 P.M. finished boiling 22 barrels - one sail
