

Cruising Around Chatham Islands
 Tuesday Feb. 5th 1884

the fore part a strong N. breeze on star
 tack stowing oil down on fore hold. 2 sails in
 sight Alaska & C. V. M. Latter part finished
 stowing 88 bbls of sperm oil. & fore ship Laying up

Wednesday. Feb 6th 1884

the fore part a moderate N. W. gale with
 Rain & fog. same 2 sails in sight. Latter part
 wind falling in to the S. W. on Port tack

Thursday. Feb. 7th 1884

the fore part wind S. W. & squally at
 5 am. whaler Rainier by Mr. Cook at Looked three
 boats Alaska close to Looked 2. 2 Boats got one
 Alaska another. cutting ours Latter part finished
 cutting Land close to 5 1/2, under our lee - A cutting
 C. V. M. part at sun down. (C. V. M. 10 miles
 of the Perimeter)

Friday Feb. 8th 1884

the fore part a good breeze from the south
 started the works. Alaska & C. V. M. part close to
 Latter part sailing the lead. porpoises & Land in
 sight. on different tacks. Harington cut his foot.

Saturday Feb. 9th 1884

the fore part a good breeze from the S. E
 on Port tack 2 sails in sight. Latter part squally
 wind moderate from the S. E. C. V. M. & Alaska in
 sight & the land. fore around at 10 P.M.

Sunday. Feb. 10th 1884

the fore part moderate breeze from the
 the S. E. on different tacks. C. V. M. & Alaska
 & the land under our lee. Latter part part E. Reef
 close to - boiling nothing but the sails been seen

Monday. Feb. 11th 1884

the fore part at strong breeze & increasing
 from the E. on different tacks. finished boil-
 ing 115 bbls C. V. M. & Alaska in sight. Latter
 part a strong gale. Alaska 1/2 mile off on weather quarter.

Cruising Around Chatham Islands
 Tuesday. Feb. 12th 1884

the fore part a strong south E gale with fog
 & Rain Latter part moderating wind backing in to
 the N. W. on port tack under short sail -

Wednesday. Feb 13th 1884

the fore part blowing heavy in squalls from
 the N. W. Latter part the same & Rain Laying under
 in it. Nothing seen sun. all well -

Thursday. Feb. 14th 1884

the fore part a fresh gale from the N. W.
 Latter part weather moderating course N. W. & N. W.
 saw C. V. M. Alaska & another whaler. Land. N. W.
 15 miles off -

Friday Feb. 15th 1884

the fore part broke out fore peak covered
 the ground & filled it with oil. Latter part
 finished Port side 74 bbls. (C. V. M. & the more
 lessail & the land has been in sight)

Saturday Feb 16th 1884

the fore part calm & very light breezes from
 the N. E. on star tack nothing in sight. stowing
 oil on star side 88 bbls. Latter part finished -
 & ran unswell as usual - wind N. W. W.

Sunday. Feb. 17th 1884

the fore part a strong N. W. breeze on
 different tacks. Latter part weather increasing wind
 hauled to the S. W. on port tack to right under N. W. S.

Monday. Feb. 18th 1884

the fore part strong S. W. wind course N. W. W.
 righted perimed at 10 A.M. fore raised. Latter part
 weather moderating a little. stood in to land & 4.30
 stood off again & perimed 12 miles off. Laying up
