Arrived At The Rock To Cruise

Tuesday, March 4th 1884

The fore part light S.W. wind current N. by E. heading the main spencer. Cutting gear at 10. Latter part calm bent N. S. a few gannets seen sun. After supper got some done up to soak. - for the morning if weather permits to wash

Wednesday, March 5th 1884

The fore part light breeze from the N. W. - washing done. Latter part finished that was on deck. At 3 P.M. sperm whales raised by the day 8 miles off. Landed 4 boats. Did not get any

Thursday, March 6th 1884

C. Rocks the fore part fine weather light air from the N. got the boat up to day. Latter part the same at 4 P.M. Curtis Rocks came in sight bearing N. by West 30 miles. Nothing moving

Friday, March 7th 1884

The fore part a moderate E. N. E. breeze Curtis Rocks close to. began to bundle down came in squally stowed the boat back again - launched 10. Latter part wind dropping goat I on our weather. Beam 20 miles off. Gannets is all that has been seen moving. - some

Wet Holes -

Saturday, March 8th 1884

The fore part strong increasing E. N. E. & N. E. wind with rain. Latter part plenty rain & baffling wind porpoises & a few fish around. Under lower topsails on different ant. tacks -

Sunday, March 9th 1884

The fore part a good breeze from the S. S. W. on star tack goat Island 1 1/2 on our sea bow. Latter part light off P. part goat I within 10 miles - porpoises & gannets is all that has been seen moving

Here and Around Goat Island

Monday, March 10th 1884

The fore part fine moderate N. E. W. & S. breeze got the boat that was washed up to launch. Latter part finished it 8960 lbs. got some more up to wash. to night between goat I & Sunday. E. porpoises is all that has been seen

Tuesday, March 11th 1884

The fore part of the day light S. W. breeze & calm on Port tack goat I & Sunday I in sight washing done. Latter part calm nothing right at 5.30 P.M. finished washing all of the boat. part of it blew. washed off. All well



Wednesday, March 12th 1884

The fore part of the day light N. N. W. breeze on star tack goat Island in sight close to broke out foot side of the main mast & built a pen for the boat. Latter part clearing up around at 3 P.M. sperm whales raised by John. Landed four boats at sunset S. B. struck & saved our weather increasing. standing away from the Land -

Thursday, March 13th 1884

The fore part strong N. W. breeze cut our whale goat Island on our star beam 12 miles off. Latter part cleared the boat & started the works. Wind slackened into the N. & began to rain. cooled down.

Friday, March 14th 1884

The fore part the day a strong West N. W. breeze & Rugged. Latter part fine wind West. Not a thing seen sun morning - fore topmast give out under the coverlet -

Saturday, March 15th 1884

The fore part fine weather wind N. N. W. on star tack goat Island & Curtis Rocks in our line. Latter part finished building & stowed the boat below. on Port tack goat I 5 miles off S. E. S. -
