

Cruising On. Casqueas
Sunday June 8th 1884

the fore part a good breeze from the E on port tack got a thin line seen latter part at 1.30 P.M. went around on star tack to night under short sail N. N. E.

Monday, June 9th 1884
the fore part the weather for this place on port tack wind S. E. & N. E. stirring the oil. Latter part finished stirring 65 lbs of oil got a living thing in the shape of whales & meat on deck 2 of 7 on A

Tuesday, June 10th 1884
the fore part a strong breeze from the E. & on star tack hills & sulphur bottoms seen. Latter part wind falling N. N. E. with rain weather increasing. All well --

Wednesday, June 11th 1884
the fore part a strong breeze from the E & very squally breaking but shook. Latter part a strong increasing weather on star tack. Not a thing to be seen moving --

Thursday, June 12th 1884
the fore part a strong breeze from the E & very squally breaking but shook. Latter part the same, on sulphur bottoms at 5.30 P.M. went around. Head N. N. E.

Friday, June 13th 1884
the fore part a strong breeze from the E & on star tack. Getting up shook. Latter part the same. Not a thing to be seen moving all well under sail --

 Saturday, June 14th 1884
24.20 the fore part a moderate breeze from the
175.22 S. E. on star tack stirring up the cases in fore part
Latter part at 1.30 P.M. whales raised by Mr Cook lowered
4 boats each boat got a whale. to night laying by them

Cruising On. Casqueas
Sunday June 15th 1884

the fore part calm with a heavy swell running. began to cut at 6.30 A.M. Latter part finished. & cleared away 3 of the heads & started the works. weather still remains calm & fine nothing seen through the day

 Monday, June 16th 1884
the fore part very light breeze from the N. N. E. calm at 11 A.M. whale raised by the crew. Latter part at 12.45 P.M. made out 3 sperm whales of them lowered 3 boats L. B & star each got a whale. to night laying with them along side & boiling -- all well

Tuesday, June 17th 1884
the fore part fine weather light breeze from the N. E. cutting the whales & boiling -- Latter part finished cutting & cleared away the heads. nothing seen since through the day & weather increasing

Wednesday, June 18th 1884
the fore part a light breeze from the N. on star tack started down a little oil between decks. Latter part on port tack boiling weather looking rainy. nothing seen since boiling

Thursday, June 19th 1884
the fore part calm & rainy. boiling on carcass & fish around. Latter part finished boiling & cleared up around. nothing seen since. all well -- wind N. E. N. --

Friday, June 20th 1884
the fore part a moderate breeze from the S. stirring oil in fore part on ground -- Latter part finished stirring 53 lbs. A few sulphur bottoms seen through the day. -- all well course west.
