Latter part fine hot a thing seen on port tack
of the minor S.E.

Monday. June 23rd 1844
the fore part a strong breeze from the
S.E. on port tack. Latter part the same
with Rain squalls. Nothing seen sun. -
Hot hole & picked over potatoes

Tuesday. June 24th 1844
the fore part following a moderate gale
from the N. by E. & S.E. Laying under storm
sails. & Rain. Latter part the same
Nothing seen sun -

Wednesday. June 25th 1844
the fore part a slight breeze from the
N. & N. by E. on star tack. with Rain & Latter
part the same. & Calm. Nothing seen sun -

Thursday. June 26th 1844
the fore part a good breeze from the
N. on port tack wind backing in to the S.
Weather increasing fast in Rain squalls. Repairing
the two works for the first time on the barge
Latter part blowing a gale from the S. Laying
under S. by N. & S.W. S. Not a thing seen sun

Friday. June 27th 1844
the fore part following strong from the S.
on port tack. at 10. a steamship passed. Laying
under S. by N. weather moderating a little
on star tack Nothing moving all well -

tack with a heavy swell from the S.W. Repairing
fore topmast stay sail & hot hole. Not a thing seen
sun through the day. - one man unwell -

Sunday. June 29th 1844
the fore part Calm with a heavy swell
from the S.W. Latter part the same hot a
thing seen sun. - to night a little breeze
from the E. on port tack -

Moving Sails
Monday. June 30th 1844
the fore part Calm. Rain squalls down
Repairing. Latter part bent m. s. & made a
pair of stow to hot hole with. porpoises & a few
fish seen sun through the day. all well

Tuesday. July 1st 1844
the fore part light breeze from the
N. by E. on star tack at 10. A.M. a young
whale raised or, mired. Covered 3 boats L.P. &
star chaser until dark. got to the ship
at 8. P.M. - mired L. P. to sail. & bent it

Wednesday. July 2nd 1844
the fore part a strong breeze from the
N. by E. on star tack at 10. mired casting to
the S. fore ship. weather increasing fast
with Rain. Works is all that has been seen

Thursday. July 3rd 1844
the fore part a strong S.E. breeze on star
tack a few hobs & overhalls in fore brace B.S.
Latter a strong breeze hobs in sight. to night
fore Round. Laying under short sail -

Friday. July 4th 1844
the fore part a slight breeze from the S.E.
on port tack. Nothing seen sun Latter part
the same. hot hole. -
