Saturday I. Aug. 30th 1844
the fore part a fresh breeze from the N
Starboard watch at 8.20 A.M. Landed for a
Run. - Latter part ship to sea -

Sunday, Aug. 31st 1844
the fore part a steady breeze from the
N. Watch went to Cascades. to go off, but un-
favorable weather would not permit. Boat went
back to ship. Latter part went to sea -

Monday, Sept 1st 1844
the fore part wind in fine watch
came off from the town & port watch got
Red & went in. Latter part got of the
Remains of the Recruits. & sold off. -

Tuesday, Sept 2nd 1844
the fore part a fresh breeze from the N.W.
stood in to land & were armed. A. Gibbs getting
water Swallow Recruits. to night wind & cold

Wednesday, Sept 3rd 1844
the fore part a strong northerly breeze
from the N.W. with a Rain & small hail
around in to the S.E. the watch came
off. Latter part Rain & squalls. Land to sea
same N.W. A. Gibbs & Swallow on our sea
Beach nothing but sun seen.

Thursday, Sept 4th 1844
the fore part a fresh breeze from the
S.E. sent a boat in to the Cascades & got off
the meat & a few chickens. Latter part Laym
off & on. nothing doing - plenty of humpbacks

Friday, Sept 5th 1844
the fore part light baffling wind
from the S.W. to S.E. sent a boat after the
coast & wife. & a few other things. at 12.30 P.M.
got aboard. we now start for the west-ward
ground. Norfolk in sight to night. Sept 6th 10. M
fog & cold as

Saturday Sept 6th 1844
the fore part a fresh breeze from the S.E.
on Port tack Land in sight. picking over potatoes &
beans. Latter part wind the same. to night Land
Philip's Island saw 20. 10. miles off. plenty of 4 fms

Sunday Sept 7th 1844
the fore part fine weather wind S.E. on
Port tack nothing but sun seen through the day -
Latter part the same. wind baffling & light

Monday, Sept 8th 1844
the fore part moderate breeze from the
N. Course E. & S. sent mainsail down to Repair -
Latter part wind the same nothing but sun seen -

Tuesday, Sept 9th 1844
the fore part a fresh breeze from the N.W.
& N. Course E. & S. sending mainsail. Latter part
31.42 Amel hallis around in to the S.E. sent mains
170.11 ail. on 11th sun seen one man untill.

the fore part moderate S.E. & E. & S.E.
breeze on Star tack fore part painting & Star Boats
31.20 making sponge & sword mats. Latter part painted
174.41 wait boat. nothing but sun seen through the day

the fore part the light breeze from the N.E.
& N.W. Course E. & S. making up water in after
31.22 hole Latter part finished & finished a sword mat
172.04 got a thing sun seen morning - one man untill

N. Braces

Friday, Sept 12th 1844
the fore part a strong breeze from the
N. Course E. making sword mat & Rave run L
31.54 main topsail braces. & put the old ones on L. & F
174.14 Latter part got hole shifted ends with the
main braces & topsail halliards.
nothing but sun seen morning -
