Thursday, Oct 12th 1884

35.17 the fore part a fine breeze from the N.
168.25 on port tack. Latter part run off a few miles
Came to on Star tack not any thing seen -
2 lbs & a few birds - & not sail 4, 5 on weather S.

Monday, Oct 13th 1884

35.40 the fore part Wind N. N. W. Rain & squalls
169.02 A. Gibbs close to on weather bow. Latter part
further increasing wind hallie in to the S. W.
Laying under storm sails &

Tuesday, Oct 14th 1884

35.11 the fore part a strong breeze from the
169.08 N. S. W. on Star tack sent the mate to a gibbs
sun whales once the 26th got one 40 lbs. Latter
part standing to the south wind backing in to
North & W. the flk is the only living thing

Wednesday, Oct 15th 1884

35.37 the fore part a strong breeze from the
169.08 N. W. with rain. Cleared late light off. Course
S. not a thing to be seen. Latter part the
same came to at 2.45 P. M. right & prop.

Thursday, Oct 16th 1884

35.01 the fore part blowing a strong S. W.
168.12 Laying under M. V. Latter part the same
not a thing to be seen morning

Friday, Oct 17th 1884

34.30 the fore part blowing strong with a heavy
168.09 swell from the S. W. took around on Star tack
& at 10 sail. Latter part bare squalls & strong
wind N. N. W. to night under storm sails &
not sail

Saturday, Oct 18th 1884

34.20 the fore part blowing a gale in squalls
164.10 from the W. on Star tack. Latter part weather
moderating a little Wind N. N. W.
Right whale porpoises is the only thing
as a few birds - on main umbell -

Sunday, Oct 19th 1884

35.52 the fore part blowing fresh from the N. N. W.
168.50 on Star tack weather increasing Latter part a
strong gale N. N. W. not any thing seen -

Monday, Oct 20th 1884

35.46 the fore part blowing a strong N. W. gale
168.88 Laying under storm sails. Not a thing to be seen.
Latter part weather moderating made S. E. 4 lbs
4.50 a whale seen on our weather beam. -

Tuesday, Oct 21st 1884

35.26 the fore part. Squalls Wind N. N. W. & N. W.
168.30 A gibbs in sight ahead at 11. A. M. 4 Swallow
came in sight & went on to the N. E.
Latter part passed to the leeward of her a gibbs on our
lee beam. to night all under short sail. Wind N. W.

Wednesday, Oct 22, 1884

35.36 the fore part Squalls Wind S. W. standing
168.58 to the west 3 sails in sight. one to windward came
down. Latter part sun. N. W. all 4 ships passed
4 lbs Othello. Dwindle 21 days out. seen nothing

Thursday, Oct 23rd 1884

34.15 the fore part a strong breeze from N. N. W.
169.40 on port tack 4 lbs Othello on our lee beam on flk -
Latter part at 1 P. M. light off. & raised 2 whales -
Lowered 4 boats 2 lbs male struck on & saved skin -
got him along side at dark. at 9.15 P. M. began to
cut & got the head landed at 3. A. M. let body lay
all hands turned in. - Othello chasing whales 6. Sun seen

Friday, Oct 24th 1884

34.12 the fore part fine wind N. S. W. at 6.45
169.12 began to cut the whales body in S. A. M. all on deck
Clearing the head made sail & more around standing to
S. Latter part started the works. scalps overboard.
at 1.30 P. M. saw 4 lbs Othello whaling. to night
she clear down.
all well. -
