the fore a Moderate breeze from the N. Steam different courses & on Port tack - scraping down latter part scraping down finish 4 heads - Not any thing seen sun throughout

the fore part a fresh breeze from the N. & Raining hard with hail around to N. N. W. again. Latter part Calm with a 4. P.M. raised 2nd Othello whaling 2 boats down but we did not see the whales. At night she is on our lee beam heading to Westward

the fore part a good breeze N. N. W. course N. E. & P. E. saw 2nd Othello on our lee beam steaming C. S. C. Latter part came to on Star tack Wind W. S. W. & W. at 1. P.M. Raised another whale on our weather bow heading to the N. - Finbacks

the fore part a fresh breeze from the N. W. Wind at 7.30. A.M. Halted in a squall to S. W. Course C. by S. & S. C. Latter part came to the Wind on Star tack. Not any thing seen sun

the fore part blowing strong from the S. W. on Star tack. & squally. Latter part the same as fore Not any thing seen sun. Wind S. S. W.
