 the fore part light breeze from the S. & S. W. Course N. E. S. stored down 29.10 lbs of oil in after sight. - Latter part finished washed decks & killed 8 shup. Not any thing seen Land went out of sight at 1. P. in Evening S. E.

Tuesday, Jan 20th 1885
 the fore part light breeze from the S. Course N. E. S. Not a thing seen morning - Latter part Course S. W. E. W. Not a thing seen

Wednesday, Jan 21st 1885
 {On the Banks} the fore part a fresh breeze from the N. Course S. E. S. W. & N. E. S. Not a thing seen morning Latter part wind N. W. on Star tack potatoes out druing - Not a thing -

Thursday, Jan 22nd 1885
 the fore part light breeze from the S. & S. W. on different tack, a few birds - Latter the same as fore a few porpoises -

Friday Jan 23rd 1885
 the fore part a fresh breeze from the N. E. S. Course S. W. Not a thing to be seen morning - Latter part same as fore part for night Lay on under S. W. E.

Saturday, Jan 24th 1885
 the fore part a fresh breeze from the N. W. Course S. E. weather increasing Latter part wind halled in to the S. E. & on port tack heading S. E. 3 fbs seen killed 4 shup. weight 226^{lb} pounds. -

Sunday, Jan 25th 1885
 the fore part calm with a heavy swell running in from the S. E. on port around. - Latter part a little air from the S. & S. E. heading to the S. W. to right & N. on Star tack.

Crucino On The Banks
 Monday Jan 26th 1885
 the fore part moderate breeze from the E. & S. E. Clouds getting a few short gies Star & put it out. Latter part thick & came in fog. wind N. E. with a S. W. Swell running. one fbs, 10 lbs B. fish

Tuesday, Jan 27th 1885
 the fore part of the day thick & foggy wind E. on Star tack heading N. E. - Latter part moderate wind the same with a heavy swell from the N. W. Not a thing seen -
 Leaving the Banks

Wednesday, Jan 28th 1885
 the fore part a fresh gale from the S. E. & S. Course N. E. Leaving the banks for the Rock Latter part wind S. W. fresh Course N. E. Not a thing seen morning - New ship to P. M. of Phat

Thursday, Jan 29th 1885
 the fore part a fresh breeze from the S. E. S. W. Course N. E. & S. E. & N. E. S. potatoes out of fore hole druing. Latter part fine wind the same under N. Not any thing seen seen -

Friday Jan 30th 1885
 the fore part wind N. E. on port tack at 6.30 A. M. were ship fair weather. Latter part weather increasing with rain falling in to the E. to right angled lower to sails & stay sails - plenty of birds. is all. -

Saturday Jan 31st 1885
 the fore part moderate breeze from the S. Course N. grammers & plenty of birds - Latter part wind halled in to the N. & N. E. on Port tack - Not any thing seen
