

Around East Island

Sunday Feb 15th 1845

the fore part blowing fresh from the S. E on different tacks. latter part weather increasing to night. Laying under E. in Topsail & S. heading S. S. W. - a few porpoises -

Monday, Feb 16th 1845

the fore part a fresh breeze from the S. E on Port tack. water out of Stubbroom - latter part same as fore at sunset. 7 o'clock & started sail on Star tack -

Tuesday, Feb 17th 1845

the fore part a strong breeze - overhauling the wire & strap blocks to main. latter part cleaned the works and any thing seen

Wednesday, Feb 18th 1845

the fore part a fresh breeze from the E. on different tacks not a thing to be seen latter part same as fore. to night courses down on Star tack -

Thursday, Feb 19th 1845

the fore part weather increasing from the E. S. E. on Star tack. latter part blowing strong at 3.30. P. M. made Linnick Rock at 5.45. now around heading N. S. E. not a living thing to be seen -

Friday Feb 20th 1845

the fore part a fresh gale from the S. E on Star tack. Linnick rock ahead - Missen topsail foot ropes down & put new ones. latter part put them up again. now around away from the Rock & got a porpoise -

Saturday, Feb 21st 1845

the fore part a fresh E. S. E. breeze on Star tack. part Linnick rock at 12. M. 2 miles to windward of it. latter part put a band around fore topmast head. & cleaning wire strap blocks -

Sunday, Feb 22nd 1845

the fore part a fresh E. S. E. breeze on Star tack. part Linnick rock at 12. M. 2 miles to leeward of us. latter part put a band around fore topmast head. & cleaning wire strap blocks

Sunday, Feb 22nd 1845

the fore part moderate S. E. breeze on Star tack at 7. A. M. hiked off. N. & at 9.55. upon whales raised by Missen. Lowered three boats. L. B. found to a whale struck downed got stove & cap sized & lost the whale. Whales when last seen going S. E. 3 or 4. Curtis Rocks & East Island in sight to night got island bearing N. N. W. 25. miles

Monday, Feb 23rd 1845

the fore part a fine breeze from the S. S. W. on Port tack most of the time Curtis Rocks & S. E. in sight. latter part fine. rounded the point & launched by after sulphur. not much seen proper to night. East S. a point on weather quarter bearing N. W. by N. 8. miles -

Tuesday, Feb 24th 1845

the fore part calm. Linnick down 2 M. T. N. E. Canvasail. & sent them again. sent in the oil. latter part remaining it a school of large whales raised by Missen. going N. E. quick. L. B. three boats down N. S. B. male in bow boat 3 male to star. L. B. male 1. & 2 male got another

Wednesday Feb 25th 1845

fore part calm. got the whales to chop & chased on them at 4.20 A. M. got sulphur set the watch got cutting gear up at 5. A. M. began to cut got one in by one noon. latter part cut the other. & at 8. P. M. started the works on head

Thursday, Feb 26th 1845

the fore part calm. heading & cutting junk. Sunday Island bearing N. N. W. 20 miles latter part very light air from the S. finished head at 11. P. M. - heading E. -
