Friday Feb 27th 1845
the fore part moderate breeze from the S.E.
on Star tack most part of the time boiling. Black
fish porpoises & Junco's & grampuses seen -
Latter part fine same as fore Sunday Island
Sailing N.W. by N. 40 miles -

Saturday Feb 28th

the fore part a moderate breeze from the
E. course N. S. W. boiling. Plenty of fish -
Latter part at 5 P.M. got dark dr. finished &
cleared up around. the 2 whales turned up 156
of good oil. Goat Island seen at 15.00 on -
Sunday Sailing N. N. E. 40 miles -

Sunday Feb 29

Monday March 1st 1845
the fore part a little breeze from the S.E.
Heading to the south east of S. 25 m
Sunday S. N. W. plenty of fish. Latter
part calm. Nothing more seen

Tuesday March 2nd 1845

Lower
Holefull

the fore part fine weather toward S.E.
Star tack. Stowing down in after hole -
Latter part Choked fit off all full lower hole
1750. & made a bone pen in port side in fore hole
Goat Island 20 miles off Sailing S.E. - "

Wednesday March 3rd 1845

the fore part moderate S.E. breeze on Port
tack Stowing down the remainder of our oil -
on Star side of main mast. 40 bbl about & the great
Casks 2 of tooline. Water that was there is on deck -
Latter part finished & got bread out not any thing
Saw Goat Island out of sig" -

Thursday March 4th 1845

the fore part calm Refrain of the oil & bent
it. Latter part set up main to front backstays & S
Rig had a wrong thing set -

Thursday March 5th 1845
the fore part calm & very light air from S.W.
course S by S & E overhaling head sheets & set up
M. Tohmatt & M. T. L. Rigante. Latter part saw mid
erate set up M. Tohmatt & M. T. L. Spring stays &
Fore T. L. rigging nothing seen. - topsails out C. O
30.30

Friday March 6th 1845

the fore part fine breeze from the N. N. W.
Heading to the S. Curtis Rocks & Goat Island
in sight. Port hole. Rattaline down Port side of
main to mast Riggings. Latter part finished -
to night calm Goat Island N.W. by N. 15. 9 miles
plenty of fish around ship -

Saturday March 7th 1845

the fore part light breeze from the S. S. E.
on Star tack most part. Rattaline down Star side
of M. T. Rig & setting up Mizzen to mast Riggings
& backstays. Latter part squaring fore to mast Ratt
lines on the topmast Riggings - plenty of porpoises
& grampuses - Goat Island to right of us N.W. by
N. miles - Sunday Island seen through the day

Sunday March 8th 1845

the fore part a fine breeze from the S. at
6.00 in a school of whales raised by the Cook
Lowered 3 boats & after wards the latter. Lar. Boat
Star B. 1. Mate cut back & cut the whales got
them on deck at 10.30 P. M. -

Monday March 9th 1845

the fore part moderate S. breeze on port
tack cleared the heads & started the works -
Latter part finished cutting punk, goat S & P
in sight - & plenty of flesh

Tuesday March 10th 1845

the fore part a moderate breeze from the
N. N. E. & sailing around in to the S. W. & N. -
Boiling. Latter part calm & very light air
S. S. E. P. Island in sight. Nothing more -
