Friday, Mar. 1st 1885

The fore part blowing a gale from the N. E. with rain but hot. Latter part weather increasing again. took in fore & miz. & set & put up the P. H. stay heading E. S. E.

Saturday, Mar. 2nd 1885

The fore part moderating down to a calm with a heavy swell running from the N. E. and main stay sail. Latter part same as fore. - Calm squalls hanging around

Sunday, Mar. 3rd 1885

The fore part weather increasing fast to a gale from the S. & very squally. - Handed over the things came around in P. M. - Latter blowing strong in squalls. -

Sunday, Mar. 3rd 1885

The fore part blowing a gale from the S. leaving on port tack. at 11 A. M. went around & set the O under lower topsails & foresail. Latter part weather moderating after 4 P. M. set mainsail & mizzen topsail. Course E. a heavy swell

Monday, Mar. 4th 1885

The fore part a fresh breeze from the S. increasing fast. Course E. Handed in P. M. - topsails & mainsail & set mizzen topsail. Latter part set mainsail again at 4 P. M. Handed courses set fore & main staysail. blowing on in squalls

Tuesday, Mar. 5th 1885

The fore part the fore part squalls from the S. Course E. Calm. & increasing again from the same quarter. made sail. Latter part weather increasing. Handed over the things but lower top. S. Course the same very squally. Rain & one hail-

Wednesday, Mar. 6th 1885

The fore part blowing strong in squalls from S. E. W. Course E. & S. a heavy swell from the S. E. set mainsail & raised upper topsails & set them - Latter part weather moderating turned reef out of 168.00 main topsail. Course same -

Thursday, Mar. 7th 1885

The fore part light air from the S. E. W. & calm closed down. Set the main spring stay again fore coat to hulk. at 12 M. aback from the O. on port tack. Latter part killed the old S. E. wind backing in to the S. E. increasing with rain. went around heading E. N. E.

Friday, Mar. 8th 1885

The fore part after rain breeze from the S. E. O. on star tack. very squally. with a storm at day break round E. Latter part same as fore. -

Saturday, Mar. 9th 1885

The fore part weather moderating from the S. E. O. wind backing back in to the S. were Phil on P. tack Latter part moderate with the fog squalls still continuing. -

Sunday, Mar. 10th 1885

The fore part a moderate breeze from the S. E. & O. on port tack & calm. Latter part closed wind backing in to the S. E. O. again. with fog squalls

Monday, Mar. 11th 1885

The fore part cloudy weather wind O on port tack weather increasing gradually. Latter part same as fore. not any thing doing

Tuesday, Mar. 12th 1885

The fore part a good breeze from the S. E. O. on port tack with a considerable rain. Latter part wind N. E. thick & foggy. at 8.30 P. M. set fly & m. & f. -
