Latter part breezing a little thick & Rainy
but hole. Course the same

Saturday May 16th 1855

No Sun

the fore part a strong breeze from
the N. & fore rain. set up to sails Course by S
Latter part moderated a little fog & Rain
Set in A. E. Course E.

Sunday May 17th 1855

No Sun

the fore part weather increasing
from the N. Course E. Handed the fore to sail &
th. S. f. Latter part set a. N. t. gain Course E by N
Rain & thick fog.

Monday May 18th 1855

No Sun

the fore part a strong breeze from the
N. Course E. by N. Latter part wind halling
N. N. thick fog. set fore & main S. f.
Log put over at 12. M. at 4 P. M. &

Tuesday May 19th 1855

mid 47.05

the fore part a strong breeze from the
S. Course E. by N. Halled the log at 6. A. M.
16. fours 1/2 miles. let mainsail.
Latter part squally. & blowing strong. Hail & a
little Rain. Course the same. - Wind S.
