

Passage To The Horn

Wednesday. May. 27th 1855

the fore part a fresh breeze from the N. W. & the S. W. broke out water flour & sugar

 Latter part wind fresh N. S. W. & W. Course the same

Thursday. May. 28th 1855

the fore part a strong increasing breeze from the S. W. continue to the south took in U. M. & L. & topsail. & reefed the foresail. Latter part blowing from the S. W. in squalls Course E. N. E. by N. & N. Snow Spd Lat 50.00 Lon 102.02

Friday May. 29th 1855

the fore part a fresh increasing breeze from the N. W. with rain Handled M. P. & L. topsails & Mizzen topsail. From N. yesterday to noon to day. 155 miles Course E. N. E. Latter part wind continue in to the S. W. fair weather & cold -

Saturday May. 30th 1855

the fore part blowing a fresh gale from the S. Course E. & E. N. E. Running under S. M. & a reefed foresail. Latter part weather increasing in squalls. At 3 P. M. came to our front tack hauled every thing & hauled out foot of M. Spencers

Sunday. May 31st 1855

the fore part weather moderating only a fresh breeze from the S. W. set lower topsails & main sail & upper M. topsail. Latter part at 4 P. M. for topsail after supper M. P. & L. Course the same Rain squalls & a heavy swell -

Monday. June 1st 1855

the fore part moderate breeze from the N. W. all sail out broke out wind. At 12 P. M. wind began to hall around in to the south Latter part breezing on fast from the S. broke out water quilled every thing but to lower topsails & set M. S. & stay sails blowing fresh

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Tuesday June 2nd 1855

the fore part light & baffling wind from the S. & W. Course E. N. E. by S. broke out the last Hums - Latter part wind W. breezing on a little - Course the same -

Wednesday June 3rd 1855

the fore part moderate breeze & baffling from the S. W. & W. Course E. by S. & S. Latter part wind baffling from the S. & W. to N. W. - very light - Course the same. 2 men unwell -

Thursday. June 4th 1855

the fore part thick & Ranic wind N. N. E. gradually backing in to the E. S. E. at Port tack shortened sail down to lower topsails & foresail / 1 P. M. furled the J. & L. Latter part weather increasing wind backing in in to the S. W. around on Star tack. to night - Head on course again quite a swell coming from the S. E.

Friday. June 5th 1855

the fore part weather moderating wind S. & S. W. Bar on sail bound to the N. W. Latter part cloudy weather saw another merchantman bound to N. W. at 2 P. M. Lower Star B. & went alongside. Station from Monterey bound to Guayaquil. Lat 55.10, Long 78.41. Seen the ice - our course E. N. E.

Saturday June 6th 1855

the fore part a fresh breeze from the N. Course E. S. at 11 A. M. part a ship bound to the West - At 12 P. M. found Lat 57.07 took in light sails & hauled on the wind heading E. by N. E. N. E. 2 men Ranks part as steaming to the Westward.

Sunday. June 7th 1855

the fore part a light breeze from the N. Course E. N. E. run to N. thick fog & rain. At 12 P. M. by 117 miles from yesterday. Wind continue a little to the N. Latter part thick fog. Course the same wind N. W. N. E. out.
