

Passage From The Horn Home

Friday June 26th 1885

the fore part stable squalls from the N. W. Course N. E. by N. breaking in lumber water. sugar. molders & wet tide -

27.45 Latter part put main yard foot Ropes up sent down fore yard & 4 ft topsail foot Ropes & overhauled them & Tared. New fls. Cib foot Ropes on merchant-man ben sun to leeward going same

Saturday June 27th 1885

the fore part moderate N. W. breeze Course N. E. by N. S. N. squalls hanging around sent down mainsail to Repair. Lower & upper main topsail yard footropes down overhauled them & tarring sail & bent it N. E. S. foot Ropes down. got the Boat out & put her on waste Cayones. & washed off deck. 2 finbacks seen & porpoises.

Sunday June 28th 1885

the fore part moderate bafferline breeze from N. W. W. Course N. E. by N. N. plenty of flks. Mand mast heads fore & main this morning after breakfast called the Mand from forward & sent the main forward - saw a school of flks Latter part very squally. Wind falling from N. E. to S. W.

22.51 29.38

Monday June 29th 1885

the fore part moderate breeze from the N. on different tacks. fore top 3 foot Ropes & lifts down. Shaking wind. Latter part overhauled fore & 4 ft foot Ropes. one sail & flks. Calm to night

29.02 29.05

Tuesday June 30th 1885

the fore part breeze from the N. & squalls Land sighted at 8 A. M. bearing N. by E. 5-8th Martin Cas. 20. 29. 28. 50th sent up foot Ropes on fore yard & lower 4 ft. fore Crotch & topsail yard foot ropes down. Latter part put new leading boards on Mizzon Rigging sent fly gibe foot Ropes out - finished the new gang way board - & put it on the House

Passage From Martin Cas. Home

Wednesday July 1st 1885

the fore part the breeze around wind N. to N. W. one sail on sight. Surving fore to mast rigging & after rounds & put the leading boards on main. Rigging Latter part wind bafferline & very squally & Rain Course N. Wind from N. W. to S. plenty of flks & lobs -

19.32 27.38

Thursday July 2nd 1885

the fore part moderate fine weather wind N. & N. E. to course N. over hauling the rigging. Shanker wangs topsail lift sent up 4 ft & main 4 ft foot Ropes - bent main 4 ft. Staysail. Surving fore to mast rigging Latter part rattline in it down. Cib foot ropes out broke out water - & bread -

Friday July 3rd 1885

the fore part a strong breeze from the S E Course N. West hole Surving up star side of fore to mast rigging. Main 4 ft lifts down & foot Ropes up making line & spung am. Latter part finished fore & Rigging - bent top crotch foot ropes & topsail - sent down Cib & topsail Lifts. taking off scotchman to paint & tarring under them. Squalls hanging around & a little Rain

Made Wind 15.57 21.30

Saturday July 4th 1885

the fore part fresh breeze Course N. E. by N. very squally. with rain one sail on sight steering a little more to E bent down N. 4 ft lifts scraped down fore & main fore 4 ft lifts down & foot Ropes rattline in down star side fore to mast Rigging. Latter part finished fore top 4 ft & over hauling scotchman fore & main one more sail on sight ahead. bent fore 4 ft. over - So ends the 9th forth at sea Ka. Ka

12.57 29.23

Sunday July 5th 1885

the fore part squally wind bafferline from E by N to S. Course N. by E. 2 sails on lea bent & one on deck down bound to the N. Latter part weather more settled from the S. S. E. fresh & clear - did not any thing more seen Course the same
