Monday July 6th 1885

the fore part of the breeze from the S. E. & course N. by E. & E. taring fore mast rigging & eyes of fore & fore. glistening Scotchman & finished seraphim down main & mizzen. 2 sails seen down to S. 2nd m. Latter part course the same cleaning the anchors & surved up fore swifters tared cues of main top Rigging for ends — 1 steamer & five other vessels seen

Tuesday July 7th 1885

the fore part of the breeze from the S. E. & course N. taring a little on fore mast. & surved up fore main swifters. Latter part seraphim main & mizzen dead eyes surved star main swifters made a sheer hole for fore rigging. after fore sent main & fore over again the 4 time since leaving day of S. sent S. & A. J. top sails. over again & glistening out a hole. several sails seen — Course N. by W.

Wednesday July 8th 1885

the fore part of the breeze from the S. E. & course N. by W. setting up fore rigging taring down the mizzen as far as the top. Latter part finished fore rigging taring down forward gib jib backstays all but fore Rigging & W. S. sent up main topsail & fore & fore & upper main topsails over a few sails seen on steamer. Course N. so ends.

the fore part of the breeze from the S. E. course N. setting up mizzen rigging Life lines out. Latter part same breeze one sail in sight seized off mizzen rigging tared the backstays down — And. C. Not Hole

the fore part of the breeze from the S. E. & course N. & N. N. W. not any thing seen walked ship in the boat out side & got star cable up to clear. Latter part cleaning the chain about 15 fathoms down wind to right S. E. very light

Wednesday July 15th 1885

the fore part of the breeze from the S. W. course N. N. W. cleaning iron work both side & painting & cleaning chain. Latter part baffling wind & calm. Squalls prevail sail up to catch water. Still kept at the cable. Not any thing seen

Thursday July 16th 1885

the fore part of the breeze from the S. W. course N. N. W. cleaning chain. Latter part a little breeze from the S. W. course N. N. W. stored about 50 fathoms chain below Not any thing seen. Course the same Rain Squalls

the fore part of the breeze from the S. W. course N. N. W. not hole cleaning the cable. Latter part cleaning cable & very squally. propellers seen.
