Saturday July 17th 1886

At 8 A.M. hoisted off our anchor & the two
towed us out to the deep hole & let go. Then main
sail & tacked twice wind dying away & thick fog
came to anchor off Ribbon Reef. Filled every thing
to right Laying off here in thick fog -

July 18th 1886.

Fog part light air from the S. S. W. & thick fog
one steamer passed us this morning bound in -
Latter part wind shifting from S.E. to S.W. & thick.

Sunday July 19th 1886

All hands employed in getting the boats ready
for whaling. Latter part the same

Tuesday July 20th 1886

Fog part course S. E. by S. wind S. E.
all employed getting the boats ready for whaling
& took out water & colling line

Wednesday July 21st 1886

Fog part course S. W. by S. with wind rising
boats & ship. Latter part the same

Thursday July 22nd 1886

the fog part moderate breeze from the
cutting stage from the S. E. Course S. E. by S. Riced the cutting stage
& got it out. Latter part employed putting on chafin
gear. Course the same.

Friday July 23rd 1886

the fog part wind H.E. & E. Course S. E. by S. rising
the ship. Latter part the same as fore with a little rain

Saturday July 24th 1886.

the fog part employed in putting chafin gear
on & Rattin down in. S. E. by S. rising. Latter part
same as fore. Not much seen one sail seen.
Course through the day. S. E. by S. Light air & calm

Sunday July 25th 1886

the fog part light air from the S. E. by
Course S. E. Latter part a little more breeze from
S. W. with squalls of rain. one whale passed at
noon steering N. W. - Not any thing more been seen

Monday July 26th 1886

the fog part a good breeze from the
S. E. by S. Course S. E. by S. Latter part same as fore
employed in making Line covers.

Tuesday July 27th 1886

the fog part a good breeze from the S. E. by
one whaling schooner in sight on the weather bow
Latter part wind the same course S. E. by S. -
Not a thing seen morning -

Wednesday July 28th 1886

the fog part a fresh breeze from the S. & S. E.
Course S. E. by S. one sail in sight. Steaming the same
Latter part a fresh breeze headed S. E. & M. T. Salant
one steamer passed us bound in to the N. W.

Thursday July 29th 1886

the fog part light air & fine weather on star
tack heading S. E. Latter part same as fore. Not
any thing seen. after supper lowered boats for practice

Friday July 30th 1886

the fog part was steady on star tack heading
S. E. by S. Latter part same as fore. after supper
lowered the boats for practice again. Not any thing seen

Saturday July 31st 1886

the fog part light breeze from the S. E. by
on different tacks. & breaking out in fore hole
Latter part finished in fore hole. Not any thing
seen. Shortened sail & over ship to the S. -

Sunday Aug 1st 1886

the fog part steady wind S. & S. E. in diff
Latter part same as fore - not any thing seen
