Wednesday Sept 15th 1886

The fore part blowing strong from the N. E. on Star tack at 9.30 wore ship. Had any thing seen latter part on Port tack blawing fresh. on star sail seen on weather quarter. Heading to the Eastward

Thursday Sept 16th 1886

The fore part a fair breeze from the N. on Port tack land raised at 8. A. M. Cooped the Remainder of the oil - Latter part got up to the land & Capt & wife went ashore at 2.30. P. M. boat came off again at dark with the mail from home. stood away from the land

Friday Sept 17th 1886

the fore part a strong breeze from the W. N. W. Discharged Lighter came off after the oil gave them what was on the Oil. Latter part got the oil out of the hole & at 2.30 22nd Lighter came off & brought the potatoes onions & 3 boxes. Our new steward came aboard to day - to light wind W. S. W. & equally. 2 vessels laying off here with us.

Saturday Sept 18th 1886

The fore part blawing a fresh gale from the W. 2.4th mate went ashore got nothing Left the cooper - Latter part wind blawing around in to the N. E. a fresh breeze for a while to sent a boat in again with 2 sick men & steward we have discharged to day at 5.30 Boat Returned. to night standing away from land -

Sunday Sept 19th 1886

The fore part blawing strong from the N. N. W. Laying off & on at Jayal. Boat went ashore at 9.30 & sent about in after him at 5.30. P. M. 2 sail Laying off & on with us. this morning picked up 6 men

Monday Sept 20th 1886

The fore part blawing fresh from the W. S. W. Laying off & on at Jayal. Boat went in & came back again. Latter part standing off. - 2 sails seen -

Tuesday Sept 21st 1886

The fore part of the day - blawing fresh from the N. N. W. Laying off & on this morning at 9.30. the Lottie Cook came out with Capt wife for a stroll off & she chanced us untill we were around & came to her at 2.30. got to her Capt Bessie came aboard & every thing all right frontier her for Jayal with Over the out board waiste boat 2nd mate went in & got the Capt. Carried one boat steerer ashore & discharged him & shipped another one in his place to night he got aboard at 7.45. Light of S. W. & S. -

Wednesday Sept 22nd 1886

The fore part a fair breeze from the N. N. W. course S. putting the onions in baskets & sweet potatoes under the table on the house. Latter part course same not any thing seen. - and a few porpoises -

Thursday Sept 23rd 1886

The fore part fine weather course S. wind N. employed in draining out shocks & setting up casks - Latter part cuttin gear up & overhauled it & finished & casks - had any thing seen - morning

Friday Sept 24th 1886

The fore part fine weather course S. E. employed in setting up gib & fly gib stays & life lines Latter part set up fore topmast & J. T. Galant Back stays - to night water out wind N. E. Course same

Saturday Sept 25th 1886

The fore part the fore part fine weather wind S. E. Course S. E. W. stroke out water in ground keel got the slop casks out & gave the 3. men over got 150 lbs of clothes. Latter part employed in making Spring an. Had any thing seen. 1. Sail though thick

Sunday Sept 26th 1886

The fore part moderate breeze from S. E. on Port tack by the wind. Latter part same as fore and a thing seen morning
