

Cruising Around Oregan & Hog,
Sunday Feb. 13th 1887

the fore part quite fine weather. at 10 A.M. weather increasing again barometer falling. course S.W. Latter part came to on port tack & altered every thing but lower sails. wind N. plenty of finbacks.

One steamer & a merchantman steering S.E.
Monday Feb. 14th 1887

the fore part blowing a fresh gale from the N. E. Latter part weather moderating a little but a heavy swell running.

Tuesday Feb. 15th 1887
 the fore part became thick & foggy kept off & made sail & kept off. S.E. weather increasing & backed on to the N. E. Latter part squally course E by S.

Wednesday Feb. 16th 1887
 the fore part blowing a fresh gale from the N. course E by S. Latter part weather moderating a little set upper main topsail - a few finbacks.

Thursday Feb. 17th 1887
 the fore part quite fine weather wind N. W. course E by S & S.E. had any thing seen. Latter part same as fore.

Friday Feb. 18th 1887
 the fore part wind N.E. course E.S.E. weather moderating increasing. Latter part wind E.N.E. by the wind had any thing seen.

Saturday Feb. 19th 1887
 the fore part blowing a fresh gale from the N.E. on P. S. Latter part wind halving on to N.E. & N. course E.S.E.

Sunday Feb. 20th 1887
 the fore part a fresh breeze from the N.E. course E.S.E. thick. Latter part fresh & cloud weather.

Monday Feb. 21st 1887
 the fore part blowing a fresh gale from the N.E. came to on port tack under lower main topsail sent the old jersail down formerly a mainsail some 50 fms. Latter part bent the homevard bound one. S. with the old. course to light. S.E. by E.

Passage Acrossed The Indian Ocean
Sunday - Feb 22nd 1887

the fore part quite moderate wind S.W. & W. a whale raised by Benson whale sun & rising & never seen again going S.W. Latter part light air from the N.W. & the course E.S.E.

Tuesday Feb 23rd 1887

the fore part moderate breeze from the N. & N.E. employed on rising up the old jersail. Latter part same as fore. Had any thing seen - course same.

Wednesday Feb 24th 1887

the fore part fine weather wind N.W. course E.S.E. a whale raised by mince. Lowered 3 boats & 4 men got the whale. Latter part at 8.30 P.M. hooked on to cut & cut until 2.20. A.M. the 25th all went below after one early B.

Friday Feb 25th 1887

the fore part at 7.30 a.m. hooked on to whale head & cut that in at noon all clear & started the work. Latter part sent later down & sent one over the bow - wind N. & W. N.W. course E.S.E.

Saturday Feb 26th 1887

the fore part thick weather. course E.S.E. sailing. wind N.W. at 8.30 whales raised by manual going quick to windward Lowered 3 boats 2 quarters & 20. never. Latter part same course.

Sunday Feb 27th 1887

the fore part thick & smoky weather wind N.W. course E.S.E. sailing. Latter part fine weather course S.E. by E. " " got the last on at 10.30. P.M. had any thing seen through the day.

Monday Feb 28th 1887

the fore part quite fine weather wind N.W. & N.E. & W. course S.E. & E. broke out by bark & many cords finished sailing & cleaned the works. Latter part wind N & N.E. course the same - turned up 18.15.
