

Passage Across the Indian Ocean

Tues. March 1st 1847

the fore part blowing a fresh breeze from the N. N. E. course S. E. by E. broke out on star side & stowed down the oil 98.20 all told. Latter part wind shifted in to the N. & night kept off again

Wednesday, March 2nd 1847

the fore part a strong breeze with a heavy swell from the N. course S. E. by E. & the fore part - Latter part wind the same & course

Thursday March 3rd 1847

the fore part blowing fresh in squalls from the S. N. course S. E. by E. & S. E. & the fore part - Latter part finished her & after 4 P.M. put her out

Friday March 4th 1847

the fore part calm & moderate breeze with squally. Course S. E. by E. Latter part the same wind falling in to the N. N. plenty of fairbacks -

Saturday March 5th 1847

the fore part with increasing wind from the N. N. W. course S. E. by E. Latter part & ended supper to sails & mizzen. at 5 P.M. came to under lower N. & Spencer. blowing fresh in squally -

Sunday March 6th 1847

the fore part weather moderating with a var. heavy swell running. light airs from the N. N. W. - Latter part at 4 P.M. a breeze from the S. W. course S. E.

Monday, March 7th 1847

the fore part quite a fresh breeze & waves squally from the S. W. course S. E. by E. Latter part weather moderating a little to night wind S. -

Tuesday March 8th 1847

the fore part very squally wind S. W. falling a little in to N. N. W. course S. E. by E. Latter part a strong breeze & squally. Course the same not any thing seen

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Wednesday March 9th 1847

the fore part a fresh gale from the N. S. W. Laying to on port tack. - Latter part weather moderating a little not any thing seen

Thursday March 10th 1847

the fore part blowing a gale from the N. & S. S. W. Laying on port tack under 2 m. T. & m. P. & S. - Latter turned up star board things out of tow & sail out of waste boat. Latter part weather moderating a little -

Friday March 11th 1847

the fore part weather moderating a little with a heavy swell running & rising sea at 6 A.M. kept off. Latter part same as fore. Course S. E. by E. mizzening fog -

Saturday March 12th 1847

the fore part fog & mizzen same course S. E. by E. with a heavy rising sea running. Latter part same as fore - wind N. S. W. -

Sunday March 13th 1847

the fore part very light airs from the S. S. W. & calm thick fog. Course S. E. by E. Latter part a breeze from N. N. W. course same - thick fog. not any thing seen

Monday March 14th 1847

the fore part calm & light airs from the S. W. course S. E. by E. Latter part breezing from the N. E. course S. E. by E. - fog most part of the time -

Tuesday March 15th 1847

the fore part fine weather course S. E. by E. wind N. E. & S. E. Latter part fog a little rain course the same

Wednesday, March 16th 1847

the fore part a strong breeze from the N. N. W. course S. E. by E. Latter part came in squally wind falling in to S. S. W. course S. E. by E. not any thing seen -
