the fore part cloudy weather wind W by N. Course
S by E. Latter part wind the same as foret course
a few pinbacks & porpoises seen through the day -

Saturday March 19th 1847

Capson

the fore part moderate breeze from the N.W.
N. N. E. Course E by S. tried to right up the Capson &
took it clear off. broke before some time or rather -
blacksmith could do nothing with it Latter part
wind N by E & N. E. on foret tack by the wind -

Sunday March 20th 1847

the fore part cloudy weather with squalls
hanging around wind S. E. on star tack Latter part
at 5 P.M. let go to a calm & draged up from the S. E.
to right on foret tack heading S. N. -

Monday March 21st 1847

S. W. Gale

the fore part blowing a strong gale from
the S. W. Laying to on foret tack under goos wing
M. T. S. M. Spencer & fore staysail. Latter part wind
continues on to W. N. W. with rain but does not knock
soot of main topsail roof off on P. side

the fore part blowing a heavy gale from
the W. N. W. Laying under lower M. T. goos winged
Latter part blowing heavy in squalls from S. W. -

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Thursday March 24th 1847
the fore part weather moderating a little at 9. A.M.
kept off S. E. wind to S. W. Latter part wind from W to
S. W. course the same. at 6.30 came to anchor on foret tack -

Friday March 25th 1847

the fore part blowing heavy from S. W. Laying
under same sail for 4 days foret. Latter part same as foret

Saturday March 26th 1847

the fore part the gale broke about day break
at 5. A.M. at 8.20 were ship on star tack wind
S. W. set foret topmast staysail & fore topmast staysail.
Latter part turned up foret & waist boats. Course S. E. by E

Sunday March 27th 1847

the fore part moderate breeze from the S. W. W.
& Calm at 10.30 wind draged up again from the W -
course S. E. by E. Latter part wind very light & calm
at 4 P.M. sent down lower main to sail not any thing seen

Monday March 28th 1847

the fore part moderate breeze from N. E. & E. N. E. course
S. E. by E. broke out in after hole foret & foret & foret &
handed the bolt to main stay & set it up. Mending L. M. T.
Latter part finished main stay & bent the topmast wind
same as foret course - not any thing seen

Tuesday March 29th 1847

the fore part a fine breeze from the N. E. & N. E.
course S. E. by E. damp weather & cloudy most part of the
time. Latter part same as foret not any thing seen -

Wednesday March 30th 1847

the fore part blowing a fresh gale from N. W.
& W. N. W. course S. E. & S. E. Latter part same as
foret course S. E. by E. -

Thursday March 31st 1847

the fore part wind W. S. W. course S. E. by E.
Latter part wind continuing on to W. N. W. course N. E. by E.
weather increasing a little. not any thing seen
