Friday April 14th 1887

the fore part a fresh breeze from the E. & S.E. on star tack shifted things out of sail for miles to the bin. Latter part a fresh breeze & a head beat sea —

Saturday April 16th 1887

the fore part a fresh breeze from the E. on star tack quite a swell running water out. Latter part wind & weather the same. Not a thing seen —

Sunday April 17th 1887

83.09

the fore part of the day a strong breeze from the E. & S.E. on Port tack Latter part weather moderating a little & a little squalls. a break seen at sun set —

Monday April 18th 1887

F.F. Gall

the fore part a fresh breeze from the E. & S.E. on Port tack at 9.30 sent J. F. Gall down & repaired it Latter part finished the sail & sent the same wind & weather the same as fore —

Tuesday April 19th 1887

File Feb 6

the fore part blowing fresh from the E. & S.E. on Port tack at 12.30 were around on star weather increasing a little Handed foresail & manded J. F. Gall

Wednesday April 20th 1887

the fore part of the day blowing fresh from the E. & S.E. on different tacks. Latter part weather one a little from the E. & S.E. one sent seen going to the E. —

Thursday April 21st 1887

the fore part of the day blowing fresh from the E. & S.E. on Port tack thick & rain squalls. Latter part weather the same. a few birds seen —

Friday April 22nd 1887

the fore part light air from N. W. Clouds Latter part weather much the same. not any thing seen. course E. & S.E. —

Passage From Tagmania To French Rock

Saturday April 23rd 1887

the fore part of the day blowing up from S. & quite fresh course E. & S.E. Rain & fog. broke out heavy sugar Rice tea coffee molasses & S. pork & cheese. Latter part rain wind the same until after 4. P.M. wind coming to S.

Sunday April 24th 1887

the fore part moderate breeze from S. & S.E. continued to the S. & S.E. course E. & S.E. Latter part rain Handed light sail & U. T.

Monday April 25th 1887

the fore part of the day cloudy weather wind S. & S.E. one merchantman in sea beam. Latter part wind falling back a little to S. & S.E. squalls hanging around look out water & bread —

Tuesday April 26th 1887

Gale

the fore part blowing fresh from the E. & S.E. on star tack. Latter part filled J. & Snigger to sails & were around. plenty of rain. —

Wednesday April 27th 1887

Gale

the fore part of the day blowing fresh from the E. & S.E. laying on Port tack were cloudy weather & rain Latter part same as fore. not any thing seen —

Thursday April 28th 1887

Gale

the fore part of the day blowing a fresh gale from the E. & S.E. laying on Port tack under m. & S. from heavy rain. Latter part same as fore —

Friday April 29th 1887

the fore part a moderate gale from the E. & S.E. laying on Port tack. fog & rain Latter part the same.

Saturday April 30th 1887

the fore part of the day Rain fog wind N. & N.W. on Port tack course & N. & S. Latter part wind about the same course same. Rain & fog. not any thing seen
