

September Cruising off Terceira

Sunday 4th

Fore part light winds from N. to N.E. been cruising between St. George and Terceira Latter part the same as fore part one sail in sight

Mon 5th

Fore part fine. wind light S.E. cruising off Terceira and St. George Latter part wind S.E. light the Mate went ashore to Terceira and got a few potatoes

Tues 6th

Fore part squally with rain gained the Sch. Edward Lee of Providence town

Latter part rainy wind S.W. quite strong gained until 5 p.m. ship on star-tack

Wed 7th

Fore part blowing a gale with rain wind N.N.E. to N.E. ship on port tack no land in sight

Latter part more moderate wind E. and clear wore ship and stood in under the land (Terceira)

Panama below as usual

Thue 8th

Fore part fine wind S.E. cruising off the S. end of Terceira in company with the Sch. E. Lee Latter part the same as fore part no whales

At Fayal

Fri 9th

Fore part fine. wind S.S.E. ship on different tacks cruising off the E. end of Terceira Latter part the same as fore part

Sat 10th

Fore part strong breeze S. this morning run off around the N. side of Terceira spoke the Bk. Reindeer Capt Baker

Latter part blowing strong S. run over under the lee of St George and shortened sail at sundown Panama still below sick

Sunday 11th

Fore part blowing strong from the S. until 9 a.m. then N.W. ship under short sail on different tacks

Latter part more moderate made some sail and beat to windward

Mon 12th

Fore part strong breeze N.N.W. at 6 got up to Fayal and at 8 a.m. Capt & Wife went ashore and sent the boat back & broke out our oil and coopered and marked to go ashore 89th Latter part strong breeze N.N.W. ship laying off and on the South side of Fayal

Tues 13th

Fore part strong breeze N.W. run down and in the harbor at 7 a.m. the barge came off with recruits and carried in our oil 16 casks and one tierce 48 gal. 2816 gals all told Latter part strong breeze W. ship lay off and on
