Fore part quite a strong breeze E.N.E. ship on port tack most of the time. Latter part the same as fore part sent down and repaired Spanker & lower & top sail

Lat 31-31 Lon 179-19 E.

Sunday 11th

Fore part fine wind N.E. ship on different tacks

Latter part fine wind N.E. ship on port tack see nothing

Lat 31-27 Lon 180-00

Mon 12th

Fore part fine wind light N.E. ship by the wind on port tack. Latter part the same as fore part repaired the jib

Lat 32-00 Lon 179-00

Tues 13th

Fore part some rain wind S.W. course N. Latter part fine wind from S. to S.E. course N.W. raised French Rock at 1 p.m.

Lat 31-31 Lon 178-36

Wed 14th

Fore part strong breeze E.S.E. and rugged ship by the wind

Latter part strong breeze E.S.E. Goat Island and Curks Rocks in sight

Thu 15th

Fore part strong breeze E. ship by the wind most of the time to the windward of the land

Latter part strong breeze E. run off around Goat Island to the westward see one sail at 5 p.m. raised two large whales going to windward lowered 4 boats & the mate went on to one and boatsteers struck him in the head and off he went. Island bearing E.

Fri 16th

Fore part strong breeze E.N.E. ship on different tacks, one sail in sight. Latter part strong breeze E.N.E. passed through between G. Island and C. Rocks

Sat 17th

Fore part wind N.E. with rain ship on different tacks. G. Island bearing N.W. Latter part moderate wind N.E. with rain ship by the wind on different tacks see black fish but no whales

Sunday 18th

Fore part strong breeze E.N.E. G. Island in sight bearing W. raised Sp. Whales lowered 4 boats L. Boat struck and saved one the others put to windward

Latter part blowing a gale E. cut in our whale and run off some to leeward

Mon 19th

Fore part blowing a gale E. furled the m top sail ship on port tack. Latter part the same as fore part raining in squalls most of the time

Lat 30-00 Lon 179-00 W

Tues 20th

Fore part still blowing from E. to S.E. and rugged ship on port tack. Latter part blowing strong from from S.E. to S.W. were ship and cut our whale up and put it in the tank to rugged to start the work

Lat 29-20 Lon 179-30

Wed 21st

Fore part blowing strong from S.W. run off until we raised G. Island then luffed too on port tack

Latter part more moderate wind S.W. and squally see a whale and called it the C.W. Morgan
