The Cap goes on lashed it up ship in the ice

Wednesday April 27th Lat 63.12
Strong Breeze from South ship in the ice

Thursday April 28th
Strong Breeze from S.E. with rain
Ship in the ice rip ship in sight

Friday April 29th Lat 63.46 Long 177.00
Ship in the ice Ice very heavy wind
from S.E. and strong air Ship in sight

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MONDAY, APRIL 1, 1889

Onboard Bark California

Saturday April 30th
pleasant weather wind from
S.E. ship in ice five Bark & Schooner &
Steamer in sight latter snowing

Sunday May 1st Lat 63.62
Ship in ice wind from S.E. middle
heard a whale spouting called it a Bowhead
Eight vessels in sight

Monday May 2nd
Ship in very heavy ice
strong Breeze from Eastward

Tuesday May 3rd
Ship in very heavy ice wind
blowing strong from Eastward at 3 P.M.
carried away the 6 Bay Bolt that the Rudder
Locks hooked in to & a large oak frame
against the rudder & carried away the two
lower Pentles worked 11 hours cutting
away the ice to clear the rudder got it in
place again & put on another extra Rudder
Jackle
