SUNDAY, APRIL 14, 1889

Onboard Bark California

Wednesday June 1st
 This day begins with light breeze
 from S.E. with some swell the S
 closed up close at 10 A.M. swell all
 gone, wind hauled to South four
 ships in sight

Lat 64.20
 Thursday June 2nd Long 175.32

This day begins with
 strong breeze from S.E. with snow
 ship fast rolled in the ice at 11 A.M. wind
 hauled to West & cleared off the land in
 Friday night Cape Agassiz bearing
 N.N.E. distant 30 miles

Friday June 3rd Lat 64.16 Long 175.15

This day light breeze from West
 ship in the ice going to the East
 quick with the current 2 ships to the
 land in sight

Saturday June 4th Lat 64.20 Long 174.38
 This day wind from S.E. ship in
 the ice the land in sight 20 miles off
 & two sails

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MONDAY, APRIL 15, 1889

Onboard Bark California

Sunday June 5th Lat 64.18
 This day light breeze from East
 hauled the ship around & headed her to
 the South & made all sail saw open water
 to the south trying to work the ship out the
 ice but could not make much head way
 saw two Steamers in close to the land
 in sight. Went head of Phoebe Bay bearing
 E by N at 1 P.M. distant 15 miles ship
 drifting quick to Southwest two other ships
 trying to work out & the Steamers no
 weather in sight

Monday June 6th

This day fresh breeze from West
 with fog all sail on the ship working
 to South & West for the open water at 10 A.M.
 got into open water & took in all sail
 but lower topsails and came to anchor with
 head yards aback heading to Eastward

Tuesday June 7th - Strong breeze from
 N.E. worked off to Westward around some
 ice & headed in to North off Phoebe Bay
