Monday Aug 29th Lat 71 10 Long 168 31
To day begins with
Strong Breeze from S. S. W. heading
S. E. by E at 8 A.M. over ship heading
N. N. West latter part died out the
Calms at 3 P.M. saw the Ice

Tuesday Aug 30th fresh Breeze from
East steering N. N. West not anything
seen at darkuffed the Wind the South

Wednesday Aug 31st Lat 72. 10 Long 168 04
To day fresh Breeze
from E. S. East heading the South
saw the Ice & the Barks Mandeville
Remond Bounding Billow Sea Ranger
Merrill I making the North & South

Thursday Sept 1st Lat 71 45 Long 168 32
Fresh Breeze from South
the Ice in sight working the southward
along the Ice saw the same Barks
& the Abram Barker came in sight
spoke her & got the mail she had
for us
