

SATURDAY, MAY 18, 1889

Sunday Oct 9th
To day fresh Breeze from
North at 7 P M spoke the John Freeman
he reported the loss of the Bark Helen
Mar on the 6th of Oct only one Boatman
saved named Phelps at 8 spoke
the Sea Breeze took his Boat Capt
Came on board five minutes left the
ship off S E by East in company
with the Sea Breeze saw three
steamers & two other boats at noon
started to sail

Monday Oct 10 Lat 68.30
To day begins with night
Breeze from North shifted S E by East
at 12 A M sighted the land Cape
Lyburne bearing E by North by Compass
left off to S by East at 6 P M and
sailed to S West finally bearing
at 5 A M stood down the coast
44 Bbls the Sea Breeze in company
with us and other boat in sight
steering the same

SUNDAY, MAY 19, 1889

Tuesday Oct 11th no Observations
To day fresh Breeze from
S S East to E S East trying to get
to South the Sea Breeze & three other
ships in sight at 9 P M came to
see more ship to the East

Wednesday Oct 12th
To day fresh Breeze
from S S East to E S East thick fog
until 11 A M saw quite a body of
ice to S West and ship in sight
latter Breeze in sight

Thursday Oct 13th
This day blowing at
Gale from E S East laying on different
back under down snow the sail of
the & Meyer staysails ball Sea running
with rain & snow
