WEDNESDAY, JUNE 5, 1889

Wednesday April 12th Lat 60 20 Long 178 07
 To day begins our much anticipated
 but not very (Sun) at 6 A M arrived
 hauls! The part I brought on for
 A Gask at 10 A M blowing heavy
 Tumbled over topmast stays! &
 Tied Tapsail came near losing
 Bow & avast Bows carried away
 Bower to avast Bows stuck to
 snow thermometer 26 above zero
 lathe part more moderate and
 slight moving two sail in
 sight

Thursday April 13th Lat 60.30 Long 178.30 Lat
 To day light breeze from
 north heading to West latter part
 hauls! the East steering N by West
 until 10 PM then luffed the aback

Friday April 14th Lat 61.00 Long 179.30 Wm
 To day fresh breeze from S W
 at day light the ice in sight at 3 A M
 saw the Barks Horatio & Mon Baines
 latter part breeze on from S East

THURSDAY, JUNE 6, 1889

Saturday April 15th No Observing
 To day fresh breeze from S East
 & East steering along the ice to West
 the ice all scattered out at 2 PM gained
 the Barks & Horatio latter part breeze
 on & snow heavy swell from S East

Sunday April 16th Lat 61 20
 To day nearly A Gale
 from East to N East had with continued
 snow laying on different tack see
 the ice & after a fast part
 breeze on strong fresh the fore
 Tapsail mostly sea running

Monday April 17th Lat 61 00 Long 179.54
 To day still blowing
 from N East latter part blowing heavy
 fresh fore Tapsail heading to East
 out any thing
