To day light blowing
wind & snowing saw three ships
& S. E. trying to work to North

Thursday April 20th Lat 61.28 Long 176.24
To day light Breeze from
North Steady through scattering S. E.
to N. West the land & four ships
in sight

SATURDAY, JUNE 8, 1889

Friday April 21st Lat 61.47 Long 178.08
To day light light breeze
working ship the East 9 small boats
Shree Knowles & Thorstein N. B. Bates
A Barker two other ship in the north
of us called them Triton Hunter

Saturday April 22nd Lat 61.40 Long 178.08
To day fresh Breeze from
North working the East Cape Horn
in sight heading N. N. East distant
40 miles the same ship in sight
spoke the Shree Knowles & Steamer
Baluga saw the Hunter with Boats
down

Sunday April 23rd Lat 61.36 Long 178.50
To day fresh Breeze from North
trying to work to North the Hunter
N. Light Triton, Shree Knowles N. B. Bates
A Barker Thorstein & two Steamers
in sight spoke the Bates & Barker
