

SUNDAY, JUNE 9, 1889

Monday April 24th Lat 61.19
To day light Breeze from
north the land in sight Cape
Y the same ship spoke the Light
& Triton

Tuesday April 25th Lat 61.16 Lon 178.04
This day strong Breeze
from north ship sailing in & then
all the other ships in sight at 10th
A.M. saw a Balwhad going quick
to the west saw him three sailings
saw the Triton with boats down

Wednesday April 26th Lat 61.13 Lon 178.53
To day fresh Breeze
from north worked the ship up to
the north and 9 ships in sight
saw the Thoratic with boats down
spoke the Beluga having struck
one whale & lost fish

MONDAY, JUNE 10, 1889

Thursday April 27th Lat 61.18
To day blowing at
Gale from north ten ships seen further
port thick & snowing the Alaskan
came in sight

Friday April 28th Lat 61.11 Lon 178.39
To day begins with Gale
from north latter part moderated
headed to the west spoke the Light
& the Balis & Beluga

Saturday
Friday April 29th Lat 61.30 Lon 178.33
To day fresh Breeze from
north heading to the west at 1 P.M.
sighted the Alaskan & Cape Comberly
spoke the Thoratic & Alaskan the
other ships in sight

Sunday April 30th no Observations
This day fresh Breeze from
north working up to north through
the ice the land in sight seeing
the west 2 ships & two steamers
in sight
