

TUESDAY, JUNE 11, 1889

Monday May 1st Lat 61 25 Long 176 27
To day fine weather
wind from North backing to East
at 3 P M lowered three boats for
a whale proved to be Grampus
all the ships in sight gained to the Light

Tuesday May 2nd Lat 61 15 Long 175 53
To day fresh breeze
from North backing around among
heavy scattering ice gained the
Fairweather

Wednesday May 3rd Lat 61 10 Long 176 01
To day fresh breeze
from East backing to the East
all the ships in sight

Thursday May 4th Lat 60 35 Long 177 00
To day light breeze
from North trying to get to the Light
gained the Fairweather & to the Light

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 12, 1889

Friday May 5th Lat 60 50 Long 178 17
To day light breeze
from West heading to the East all
the ships in sight got 2 seals

Saturday May 6th Lat 60 50 Long 178 17
To day ship in ice
forging through to the East wind
from West all the ships in sight

Sunday May 7th Lat 61 08 Long 178 41
To day light breeze
from West ship in the ice gradually
forging through to the East at 8 AM
saw the Walrus & a Booby bird
Boats down we saw two Whales in
a hole the gutter tried to get to them
across the ice saw them again going
to the West all the other ships in sight
