S West laying in A hole all the ships
in sight gained the Horatio

To day begins with
fresh Breeze from S West at 10 A M
hauled off the north worked the Eastward
all the ships in sight 10 in all gained
the Alice Knowles

Thursday May 11 Lat 61 20 Long 179 48
To day light Breeze from
S S East working through ice the north
all the ships in sight

FRIDAY, JUNE 14, 1889

Friday May 12th Lat 61 40 Long 179 41
To day light Breeze from
E S East worked through ice and set in to
A hole to the north all the ships in sight
saw the Hunter & Light & Horatio with
Boats down the Horatio got A whale

Saturday May 13th Lat 61 45 Long 179 42
To day fresh Breeze from
S East laying around in the same hole
some of the ships saw whales the
Alice Knowles & Light went into
the ice to reach the Horatio Baiting

Sunday May 14th No Observations
To day fresh Breeze from
S East went into the ice heading
the north all the ships the same

Monday May 15th No Observations
Ships in the ice close
to the Horatio blowing & snowing from
N N East all day gained the Hunter
the other ships in sight
