Sunday May 21st No Observations
To day fresh breeze from
S.W. with working through the ice to N.E.

Monday May 22 Lat 61 43 Long 179 40
To day light breeze from
S.W. with ship in the ice spoke the Belvedere
with four Whales saw the Thoratic
Guthrie & the other ships in sight Cape Horn
bearing to N.W. by N.

Tuesday May 23rd Lat 61 54 Long 179 28 Cent
This day nearly gale from West
ship in the ice saw all the other ships saw
the Barker & Thoratic with sails down think
they struck a whale & lost their hoisting
hooking to N.W. by N. distant 20 miles
