MONDAY, JUNE 17, 1889

Wednesday May 24th

To day nearly a gale from north with snow latter part moderated & cleared up at 9 P.M. saw a Whale close to the ship in a boat nearly got to him but the vessel heard him spouting several times further off the two Boats & Schooner & Reindeer came in sight to the westward

Thursday May 25th Lat 62.10 Long 179 15 West

This day light breeze from West ship fast in the ice at 3 P.M. struck a Whale off the ice with a starting gun 1/2 mile from the ship saw him spouting thick blood saw him three times after then did not see him any more think he died 14 sailing ships & one Steamer in sight & the land saw several whales saw the Reindeer with Boats down

TUESDAY, JUNE 18, 1889

Friday May 26th

To day ship in the ice the same ship in sight saw the Schooner with Boats down the land in sight

Saturday May 27th

To day fresh breeze from north made sail & tried to work out of the ice at 9 P.M. got out that some ships in sight & Cape having being 4 to 5 miles

Sunday May 28th

To day nearly a Gale from north ship in clear water & latter part some moderate gales the Brig Boutar

Monday May 29th

To day fresh breeze from north galed with the weather light & fair & the weather & Boutar & Rosario having being 4 by West
