Saturday July 15th Lat 55.15 Long 16.30
To day moderate Breeze
from West steering S.E. at the Standard
in sight steering the same saw another
Ship heading the North at 5 PM
sighted the Land of Oumalooka

Sunday July 16th To day light Breeze
at 11 A.M. Anchored in Dutch Harbor
The Men Bopies sailed

Monday July 17th At Anchor employed
in getting ready for water got 150 Bbls

Tuesday July 18th At Oumalooka
getting Coal

smoked ship
