Saturday Aug 19th To day strong
Breeze from N East on difficult
tacks trying to get past some
the land off Mainwight Inlet

Sunday Aug 20th To day nearly
A gale from N East with rain
saw the land Point Belcher

Monday Aug 21st at anchor at
Point Belcher trying to get
round Mount St. Michael at
Anchor taking out her Rudder.

Tuesday Aug 22nd at anchor at
Point Belcher coming from N East

SUNDAY, JULY 14, 1889

Wednesday Aug 23rd To day fresh
Breeze from South at 6 AM left
Point Belcher for Point Barrow
at 11 PM came to anchor off
the Refuge Station to get our Potatoes

Thursday Aug 24th To day fine
Breeze from East got off our Potatoes
& took the anchor & started for
West several ships here steering N. E. W.
but the new sails

Friday Aug 25th Lat 71.35 To day strong
Breeze from E N E steering N. by South
with all sail set not any thin seen

Saturday Aug 26th Lat 71.40 Long 190 40 To day fresh Breeze
with fog from N East at 9 AM sighted
the ice gained the St. Barker & Mainwight
the Andrew Thicks & Mainwight in sight.
