

WEDNESDAY, JULY 17, 1889

Sunday Sept 3rd Lat 71.34 Long 172.30
To day fresh Breeze
from N. East at noon steered off
along the Ice to West saw some
ships saw the A. Barker with Boats
down at 3 P.M. sighted Herald Island
bearing S West.

Monday Sept 4th
To day fresh Breeze
from N. East steered in to N. West
until 4 P.M. left the S. East by
the wind spoke the Hammer Herald
Island in sight bearing S. West
the Hammer Thorstein Reindeer &
A. Barker in sight.

Tuesday Sept 5th Lat 71.35 Long 173.45
To day strong Breeze
from N. East working to Eastward
the same ships in sight & Bounding
Billow & Triton in sight saw
the Hammer chasing whals the Island
bearing S. West.

THURSDAY, JULY 18, 1889

Wednesday Sept 6th Lat 71.30 Long 172.25
To day strong Breeze
with snow squalls from N. East
spoke the Triton several other ships came
in sight at 2 P.M. steered off to Westward
along the Ice at 6 left the at 5 saw
A. whale spout 5 times could not make it
out did not see it again.

Thursday Sept 7th
To day strong Breeze from
N. East about the whole fleet came in
sight leaving off to on the Ice the Island
in sight bearing S. West by South spoke
the James Arnold.

Friday Sept 8th Lat 71.40 Long 173.17
To day strong Breeze
from N. East leaving off to on
the Ice all the ships in sight,
saw the Triton chasing A. whale.
