To day strong Breeze
from N.E. East working the windward
all the ships in sight

Sunday Sept 10th Lat 71 35 Long 172 12
To day strong Breeze
from N.E. East lapping off & on the ice
spoke the northern light.

Monday Sept 11th Lat 72 00 Long 173 06
To day fresh Breeze from
N.E. East heading N.W. West at
8 P.M. tacked saw 12 ships

Tuesday Sept 12th Lat 72 40 Long 173 00
To day fresh Breeze
from N.W. West off & on the ice 24
vessels in sight saw the Jessie
Freeman came in sight & started
to the East again saw the Alorha
with Boats down

SATURDAY, JULY 20, 1889

Wednesday Sept 13th Lat 72 40 Long 171 20
To day fresh Breeze
from N.E. East started off & then for
three hours came in thick drift to
13 ships in sight & ice

Thursday Sept 14th No Obs
To day light Baffin
wind from Eastern back 16 ships
in sight saw the Reindeer with
Boats down gained the other knowledges
of Arnold from Baylis

Friday Sept 15th No Obs
To day strong Breeze
from East with rain & foggy saw
4 or 5 ships

Saturday Sept 16th No Obs
To day fresh Breeze
from N.E. East heading N.W. West at sundown
tacked & set close in to the ice must
be in about 78 degrees with sun
& land
