Tuesday Sept 19<sup>th</sup> Lat 71 50 Long 171 48  
To day strong breeze  
from West heading in the north at  
midnight came up to the ice taken  
our own sail

Wednesday Sept 20<sup>th</sup> Lat 72 15 Long 172 26  
To day begins with light  
breeze from West with foggy rather  
clear & nearly calm heading  
to the South Litter got a breeze  
from N.E. at about 8 P.M. at

Thursday Sept 21<sup>st</sup> Lat 71 40  
To day fresh breeze from  
N.E. at 9 o'clock with a Breeze of Allen  
& Skarka at noon come in foggy

Friday Sept 22<sup>nd</sup> Lat 71 30 Long 172 58  
To day light breeze  
from N.E. at 10 o'clock for the time  
spoke the Steamer Thrasher & Schooner  
Rosario

Saturday Sept 23<sup>rd</sup> Lat 71 40 Long 170 46  
To day strong breeze  
from East heading N.E. at 6 P.M.  
seen

Sunday Sept 24<sup>th</sup> No Chs  
To day light breeze  
from N.E. at 10 o'clock steering S.E. West at  
6 P.M. shifted to wind heading E  
S.E. at 11 o'clock for nearly calm
