Monday Sept 25th Lat 71.30 Long 172.00
To day began with
light breeze from N. East steering S by
West at noon wind & weather
giving to S West lowered p. Boats
at 3 PM the Boat struck him
& soon after rolled the Boat over
the Mast Boat struck him again
& turned him up at Six PM got
every thing on board & got ready
to Tent, Boatswain on string
& thick snow storm saw
fire other sail

Tuesday Sept 26th No Obs
To day fresh breeze
from N. East got the Headland
away then steered off S. East
after the Anderson Hicks &
Arnold two other sail in
sight at 7 PM started the Boats

WEDNESDAY, JULY 24, 1889

Wednesday Sept 27th Lat 71.15 Long 173.45
To day strong breeze
from north heading N. West at
8 PM went ship to East employed
in Boiling & run down some of the
Oil & ships run

Thursday Sept 28th No Obs
To day strong breeze
from north employed in Boiling
saw Herald Island being N. by South
distant 26 miles saw three ships
at 8 PM finished Boiling run down
some of the Oil

Friday Sept 29th Lat 70.50 Long 172.17
To day strong breeze
with snow from N. East heading
N. West saw two sail started
down the remainder of the Oil
135 Bbls all told
