

MONDAY, JULY 29, 1889

Saturday Oct 14 Lat 62.16 Long 165.00
To day begins with a gale
from N.W. with middle & latter
moderated but on many sail
trying to work to westward
at 10 A.M. sighted the land Cape
Krukenstein at 4 P.M. sighted
the land on the East side and sail

Sunday Oct 15 Lat 66.15 Long 168.36
To day blowing strongly in
a gale with snow from N.W.
to N.W. heading I went carrying
reefed topsails & courses until
3 P.M. then shortened down
at 6 a.m. ship heading to south
must have been about 110 miles from
East Cape but thick snow mist
of the time saw to sail at 11 P.M.
saw ship to south

TUESDAY, JULY 30, 1889

Monday Oct 16th
To day strong breeze from
N. West at 6 A.M. sighted the island
Diognet Island bearing West & Goreau
Rock bearing S.W. by South passed
to East of the Rock then steered
off S.S. East at 8 sighted ice
at 10 sighted Kings Island passing
ice all day had to keep off
I went to clear it and times
and sail in sight steering the sail

Tuesday Oct 17 No Obs
To day strong breeze from
N. West at 2 A.M. passed St. Lawrence
Island then steered S by West all
day met any thin ice here

Wednesday Oct 18 Lat 59.20 Long 171.00
To day light breeze
from N. West to strong S.S. East at 5
P.M. wind backed the S.S. East heading
S. East saw the Island of St. Matthews
at 7 1/2 A.M.
