Monday June 4th

To day light Breeze
from North fast to ice off North
Head employed in setting up Casks
& Stowing off the ground tier in main
hatch Mr Back John & Smith
the Anchors here at four & the
Jesse Freeman left for East Cape
at 4 P.M. left the ice & steered S by West
under sail

Tuesday June 5th

To day nearly Calm
Ship steering S by West under sail
the John & Smith & Anderson Thicks
in sight

Wednesday June 6th

To day light Breeze
from West steering S by West
St Lawrence Island at 2 P.M. came
to ice north west along the ice
saw a bird spoke the Fulton
