3 P.M. hauled off & Anchored

Thursday June 28th At Anchor in Dutch
Harbour got off the Potatoes two Boats
went. Had fishing got about 5 Bbls
the hatched Sails

Friday June 29 To day fresh Breeze
from N.W. the hatched came back
the Cutter Adams arrived & Coal Steam
Hillmanic

Saturday June 30th To day fresh Breeze
with foggy from N.E. East Three Boats
went seeing fast Salmon caught
1200. The hatched sailed The Mohican
arrived & the Str Lakme

Sunday July 1st To day fresh Breeze
inside at 8 1/2 P.M. took Anchor
& started out under Steam steered
N.W. 1/2 N. wind out side N.W. West
& thick foggy saw the Forktown
coming in

Monday July 2nd To day fresh Breeze
from N.W. West with foggy clearing
N.W. 1/2 N. West under Steam fast
6 1/2 P.M. wind hauled to West stoped
Steaming & made all sail heading
N.W. West
