

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 1889

Saturday July 21st
To day fresh Breeze
from N East to East Steaming
for Cape Smith at 8 A.M. made
port to the Ice off Cape Smith at
3 P.M. floated down to the gunning
station & made port again
raining most all day

Sunday July 22nd
To day begins with
light Breeze from S West with thick
foggy at 1 A.M. Ice came in around
the ship had to fleet west in behind
the ground Ice & made port again
the other Steamers had saw three Sailing Ships

Monday July 23rd To day light
Breeze fresh N East port to the Ice
the Orca & Thrasher went out & towed
in the G. M. Winthrop & Mauderer
saw another Bark called it the
Alice Knowles

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 1889

Tuesday July 24th
To day fresh Breeze
from N East ship left to the Ice
off the Ducking station and of the
ships anchored to South of the
Point the Tatum came in

Wednesday July 25th
To day begins with
light Breeze from South with foggy at
11 A.M. foggy cleared left the Ice & started
around the Point all of the Steamers
& worked to Eastward

Thursday July 26th
To day light Breeze
from North working to Eastward at 6 A.M.
came by Anophe in five fathoms water
off Cape Falket at 1 P.M. took the
Anophe & tied up to ground cake of
Ice at 8 P.M. floated west to East &
made port again the papers carried
away fish Boston fuel of the Orca
