

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, 1889

Friday Aug 17th
To day fresh breeze
with fog from 10 to 12 but not up

Saturday Aug 18th
To day nearly calm
went down under Cross Island
& anchored. The Thrasher & Beluga
getting their stuff from freight
at 12 PM came back to
Eastward & tied up to the ice

Sunday Aug 19th
To day nearly
calm at 6 AM let go the ice
& started to Eastward with the
Orca Thrasher & Beluga. The other
steamers out of sight at noon
visited the Water Bay at 4 PM
came to ice we could not get
through off Godmans Island
hid up to the ice for the night
the Baylies with us

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 1889

Monday Aug 20th
To day fresh breeze
from N. East at 7 1/2 let go the ice
& worked out through the short
to Eastward at noon got in to
quite deep water off Cadden Bay
then hoisted hel up at 9 PM camp
to ice & came in fog off Martin
Point run into a block of ice
& the Chap in the cut water where
the lower Bobstay shakles on
among heavy ice all night
the Thrasher Beluga & Orca with us

Tuesday Aug 21st
To day begins
with fresh breeze & thick fog from
N. East among the ice at 13 AM
foggy but a little worked out
off the ice at 4 1/2 got in the clear
water then shut in thick again
steering N. E. by E 1/2 East under
single Bell for Pullen Island
saw the Thrasher Beluga Orca &
Baylies while it was clear at 2 1/2
PM sighted Hershal Island & the other
steamers saw the Junette & Schwanter going
in to the Island
