SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 1889

Thursday Nov 28th. Lat 36.45 N. Long 144.32 E.

Today blowing a moderate gale from S W. Steering N N E. At 2 p m all sail in but lower main top sail. At 8 p m hove to on port tack.

Friday Nov 29th. No Observation.

Today begins with a gale from the S W. At 3 A M wind hauled to N W, and moderated. Set fore top sail. Heading from E to N E. Raining most of the day.

Saturday Nov 30th. Lat 37.48 N. Long 143.17 E.

Today moderate wind from the North with some rain. Ship on different tack. At 5.30 a m, saw a spout called it sperm whale did not see them again. At 2 p m raised sperm whale, going quick to the eastward, saw him two raisings, did not lower. wind died out to nearly a calm. Saw two schooners.

Sunday Nov 31st. Lat 38.36 N. Long 144.6 E.

Today begins with a moderate gale from the N W. Heading N N E to N E. Latter part moderated. Saw several schooners.

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MONDAY, NOVEMBER 11, 1889

Monday Apr 1st. Lat 39.40 N. Long 145.17 E.

Today strong breeze from the West. Steering N by E. Saw a Steamer steering East. Saw several Seal, and plenty of birds.

Tuesday Apr 2nd. Lat 40.55 N. Long 146.1 E.

Today moderate breeze from E to West. Steering N by E and N by W. Set up crows nest. Saw lots of birds. Nothing of note transpired.

Wednesday Apr 3rd. Lat 42.25 N. Long 146.40 E.

Today fresh breeze from the South. Steering North until 8 a m, then E N E until 12 m then East by South. At 2 p m raised a whale to windward, called it a right whale. At sun down took in light sail, heading E. S E by wind.

Thursday Apr 4th. No Observation.

Today light air from the North. Heading to the Eastward. Thick fog. Bent new Main Spencer.

Friday Apr 5th. No Observation.

Today light air from the eastward. thick fog. Ship by the wind on different tack.
