THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 1889

1895

Sunday Apr 14th. Lat 42.50 N. Long 149.30 E.
Today strong breeze from the South.
heading E. S.E. At 6 p.m. wore ship, heading West.
Saw several fin backs.

Monday Apr 15th. Lat 43.16 N. Long 149.8 E.
Today fresh breeze from S.W. to W.
heading from W. N.W. to N. N.W. At 5 p.m. tacked to
the South. Saw several fin backs.

Tuesday Apr 16th. Lat 43.24 N. Long 148.21 E.
Today fresh breeze from the S.W.
heading N.W. At 2 p.m. wore ship, heading
S. S.E. Saw fin backs.

Wednesday Apr 17th. No Observation.
Today fresh breeze from the East
heading S. S.E. At 4 p.m. breezed on string with
rain. At 7 p.m. wore ship to North. Saw fin backs.

Thursday Apr 18th. No Observation.
Today fresh breeze from North
to West with fog. Nothing seen.

Friday Apr 19th. No Observation.
Today begins with a light breeze from the East. At 8
A.M. a Right Whale came up close to ship. lowered
four boats chased him several times, then shut in
foggy. Took boats up at 11. Whale going to the West.

1895

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 1889

Saturday Apr 20th. No Observation.
Today wind blowing fresh
from S.E. with fog and rain. heading N.E.
Lower fore top sail furled. Considerable
Thunder and Lightning during the night.

Sunday Apr 21st. Lat 43.12 N. Long 148.50 E.
Today begins with a fresh breeze
from the S.W. At daylight raised two Right
Whales. Lowered four boats, chased the
Whales until 4 P.M. without success. wind died
out. At 6 P.M. sprung up from the West. Saw
three different whales. Whales working to West.

Monday Apr 22nd. Lat 43.05 N. Long 148.32 E.
Today fresh breeze from N.W. At 6 A.M. raised a Right Whale. At seven
lowered four boats. At 9 A.M. the W Boat
struck and killed the Whale. The Whale
sunk, took all his line, and L Boat line.
then bent on B Boat line, took a few fathoms
of that, then cut. At 10 A.M. took up L and
W Boats. the other two boats in pursuit
of another whale. At 12 O'clock took them up.
At 1.30 P.M. lowered three boats without suc-
cess for another whale.

Struck and sunk.
