MONDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 1889

Thursday May 2nd. No Observation.

Today begins with a fresh breeze from the South. At 7 A.M. raised a Right Whale. At 8.30 lowered three boats. The Larboard boat struck and saved him. got him along side at 12 M. Had dinner and then cut up the whale. Latter part strong breeze and some rain.

Friday May 3rd. Lat 42.50 N. Long 149.4 E.

Today begins with a strong breeze from the S. S.W. with rain. Cleared away the head of the whale. At 1 P.M. stopped raining wind died out nearly to a calm. At 2 P.M. a Right Whale came up close to the ship. At 3 P.M. lowered three boats, and chased him until 6 P.M. No wind could not strike. Employed in getting ready to boil.

Saturday May 4th. Lat 43.44 N. Long 149.11 E

Today nearly a calm all day. At 7 A.M. saw a Right Whale come close to the ship, shot him and did not see him again. Employed in boiling. Saw fin backs. Rm twenty five bbls oil down.

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TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 1889

Sunday May 5th. Lat 44.00 N. Long 149.43 E.

Today nearly calm. At 4 P.M. finished boiling. Saw fin backs.

Monday May 6th. Lat 44.20 N. Long 150.33 E.

Today begins with a moderate breeze from S to S.W. Steering N.E. by East until 2 P.M., then luffed to the wind heading S.E. by S. Stowed down remainder of oil. Saw fin backs. Foggy at intervals.

Tuesday May 7th. Lat 44.11 N. Long 150.35 E.

Today light breeze from the S.W. with fog most of the day. Heading S.E. Saw fin backs and Grampse.

Wednesday May 8th. Lat 44.00 N. Long 150.58 E.

Today light breeze from S to S.E. with fog most of the day. At 10 A.M. stowed S.W. Saw fin backs.

Thursday May 9th. Lat 43.40 N. Long 149.08 E.

Today's fresh breeze from S.E. to S. Heading from S.W. to W. S.W. Nothing of note transpired. Saw fin backs.
