SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 30, 1889

Wednesday July 3rd. No Observation.
Today light breeze from the
South with fog, heading West. Saw Killis.

Thursday July 4th. Lat 57.32 N. Long 169.06 W.
Today moderate breeze from N East.
with fog most of day. Steering S East.

Friday July 5th Lat. No Observation
Today fresh breeze from North to
West N West. The Island of St George bearing
N S West. Gammed the Alice Knowles.

Saturday July 6th Lat. 56.57 N. Long 168.30 W.
Today nearly calm. At 11 AM
saw a Right Whale going to the North.
Lowered four boats, saw him three times, then
it went out of sight. Alice Knowles in sight.

Sunday July 7th Lat 57.09 N. Long 167.54 W.
Today fresh breeze from the W
N West. Heading North. Gammed the Alice
Knowles. Saw Sulphur bottom.

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SUNDAY, DECEMBER 1, 1889

Monday July 8th Lat 57.06 N No Obs.
Today light breeze from W N West,
to N N West. Heading S W to West. At 5 PM
was ship heading N East. Fog most of the day.

Tuesday July 9th Lat 57.13 N. Long 168.24 W.
Today light breeze from the East,
with fog. Heading North.

Wednesday July 10th. No Observation.
Today fresh breeze from E, N East.
Heading S East. Saw Killis.

Thursday July 11th Lat 55.50 N. Long 168.45 W.
Today fresh breeze from the
North East. Heading S E by East. Bumped
the Bone. Saw Fin back.

Friday July 12th Lat 54.55 N. Long 167.15 W.
Today light breeze from the
N East. Steering S E by East. At 6 1/2 A M sighted
the island of Alaska.

Saturday July 13th
Fresh breeze from the N West.
At 6 AM came to anchor in Dutch Harbor at
Aniakchak, in 17 fathoms of water. The Andrew Kieba
Lydon, Alice Knowles and Mermaid here.
